- A motion was made and seconded to accept the estimated pricing from C & C Home Remodeling to complete the repair of a foundation leak in unit 36 for a cost of \$400.
 This repair is to paint the new drywall which was not done by the previous handyman who had ghosted us before the project was completed. Vote: Passed

Landscaping:

- The fence company has fixed the pickets of the perimeter fence but there are still some gaps at the bottom which need to be addressed.
- There has been a complaint brought to the attention of the city about the raccoons getting into the dumpster by the hill. We are looking into alternative possible solutions to hopefully rectify the situation.
